THE ROLE OF MEDICINES IN REHABILITATION

Insights by
Dr. P. Hanumantha Rao
Rehab Pediatrician

1. AWARENESS OF MODERN TREATMENTS

Stakeholders in Rehabilitation Doctors, paramedics, and families must stay informed about modern treatments, including Cochlear Implants, Hydrocephalus surgery, and new aids like wheelchairs and calipers.

2. AYURVEDIC MEDICINE

Since Sushruta's time, Ayurvedic medicines have been used to support brain health, especially for Autism, ADHD, developmental delays, learning disorders and behavior problems

3. MEDICINES FOR BETTER BEHAVIOR

Medications reduce restlessness, anger, and improve stability, focus, sleep, and eye contact, paving the way for more effective therapy.

4. HOW MEDICINES HELP

They balance neuro-transmission, boost cognition, and enhance brain function, improving overall mental health by promoting Neurogenesis, Neuroplasticity, Neuroprotection.

5. SUPPORT BEFORE THERAPY

Let children receive support from rehabilitation or developmental Pediatrician before therapy, it goes a long way in achieving good improvement and fast recovery. Medicines, when used Judiciously, are safe and make a sea change in giving quality of life to the autistic or any child with behavior problem.

6. THERAPY AFTER MEDICAL SUPPORT

Starting therapies after medical intervention will improve the child's brain for reception, interpretation and output of the commands. Further reduces stress on therapists, improve the mental health of all stakeholders involved in therapy and leads to quicker results.

7. TEAM EFFORT IN REHABILITATION

Success comes from working together, not as individuals. "One can achieve anything provided one does not mind who gets the credit"!
